"My dog Bug was my best friend for 15 years, I couldn't love anyone or anything more if I tried. He was my shadow and my confidant, he bounced at my joy and licked away my tears.

When Bug got really sick it all happened so fast, he had been suffering from a partially collapsed trachea for about eight years at that point and then all of a sudden one day it collapsed

altogether. That was the hardest time of my life, losing him felt impossible. Paying for him to get all of the treatments that he needed at the time also felt impossible. # Our Story



## About Us

PAWS was founded in 2012 by a group of volunteers who were astonished at the rate of unnecessary euthanasia in their community. They identified the need for increased wellness measures to prevent the needless loss of our furry family members.

We became a registered charity in 2022. Since that inception, we've made it possible for **458 human guardians** and their **491 companion animals** to get essential care.

In addition to subsidizing veterinary care for the most vulnerable members of our community, we prioritize education and prevention. We've developed online resources that help thousands each month, regardless of location or socioeconomic status, find information about **wellness, prevention, and available resources**.

## Our Mission

Progressive Animal Welfare Services is dedicated to supporting the welfare of humans and their animal companions. We subsidize and improve access to veterinary care and offer solutions and education for people and community agencies. We aim to reduce suffering, overpopulation, and unnecessary euthanasia or surrender to shelters and animal control organizations.

## Our Values

People need pets. Animal companions bring proven benefits for human physical and mental health and are particularly valuable for those in-crisis or living with disabilities. By giving pet owners assistance during difficult times we help keep families together and lift the whole community.



# Who We Serve

**PAWS' programs provide subsidies to help fund both preventive and emergent pet care to low-income families, ensuring that pets receive the care they need to stay healthy and avoid being surrendered or euthanized.**

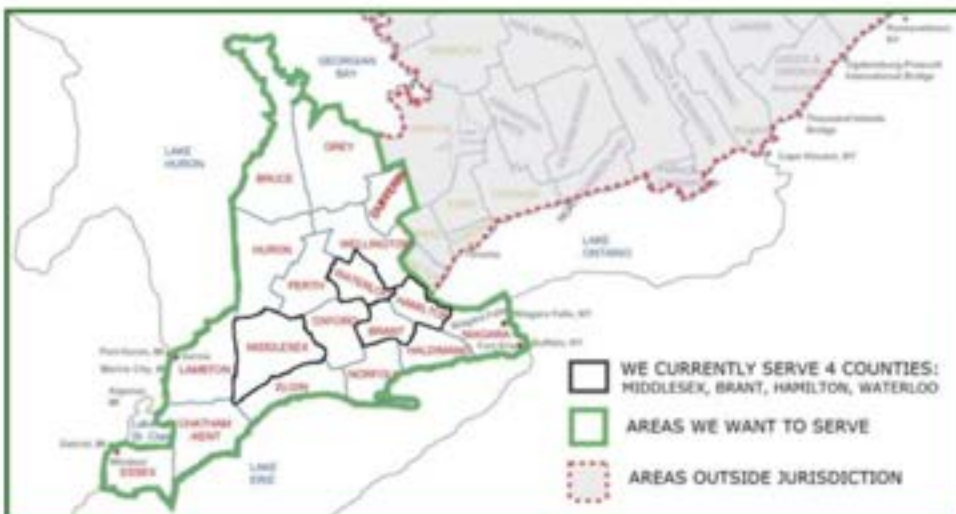
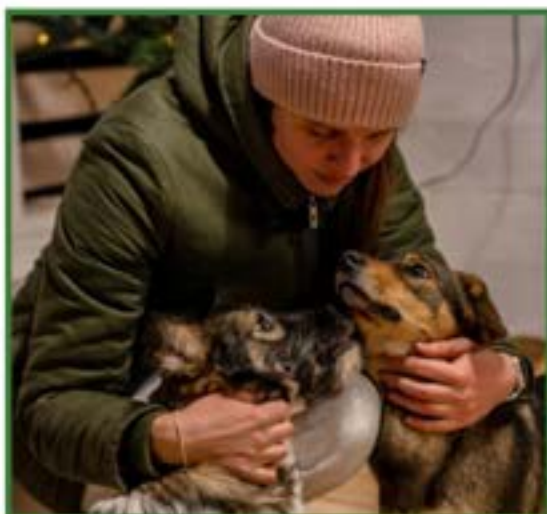
Members of the public with inadequate income (per published Low-Income-Cutoff data) who are unable to afford the cost of required, medically necessary veterinary care can apply for a subsidy. PAWS allowances improve access to preventive and critically-needed vet care.

Companion animals provide invaluable, life-changing benefits to their caregivers. Their loyalty and unconditional love not only give caregivers a feeling of complete acceptance, but pets can also empower them to lead healthier, active, and energized lifestyles.

Financial instability, housing insecurity, disability, and domestic violence can impact anyone with the full force of their brutality. Individuals going through crisis situations can find themselves feeling alone and isolated, without a friend in the world. This can seriously deteriorate one's mental and physical wellbeing.

We offer a subsidy to those who meet our criteria in the counties of Middlesex, Brant, Hamilton, and Waterloo. We look forward to expanding our service area as funds allow.

We also work with community agencies to become pet-friendly thus reducing the need for separation between people and their companion animals. Our education team develops written materials, accessible to all, on our website focused on prevention.

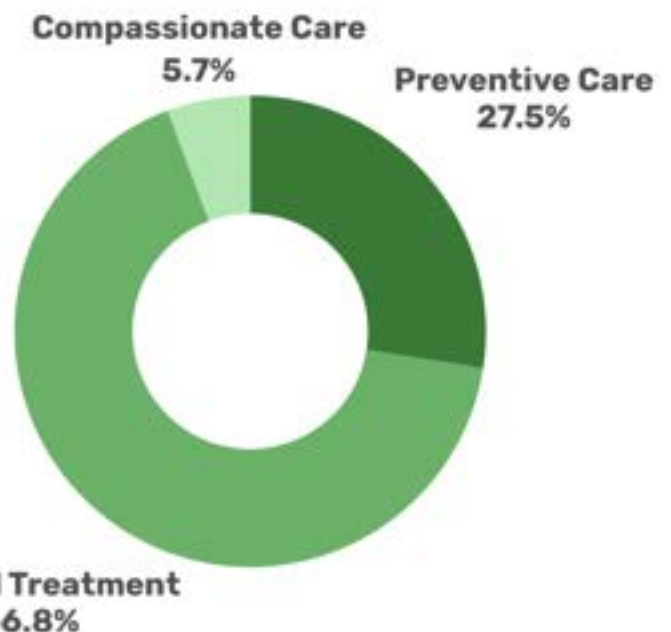

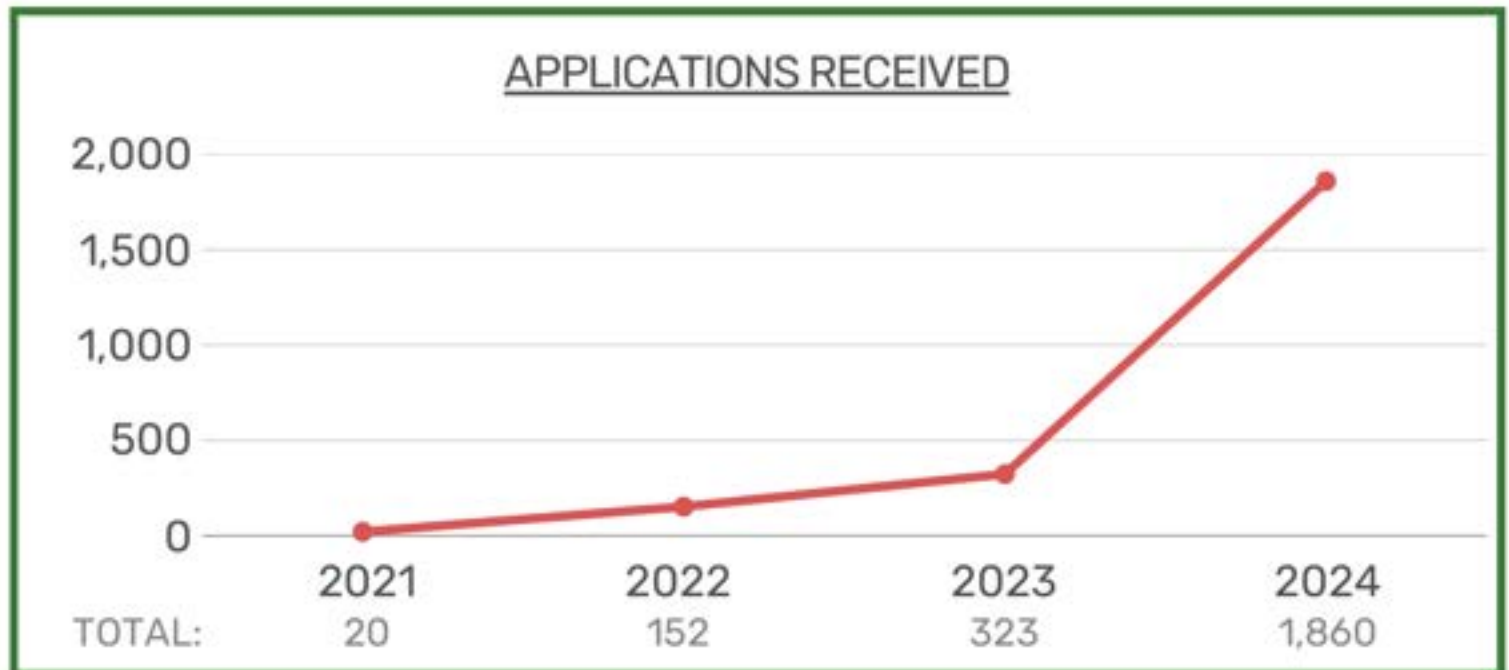

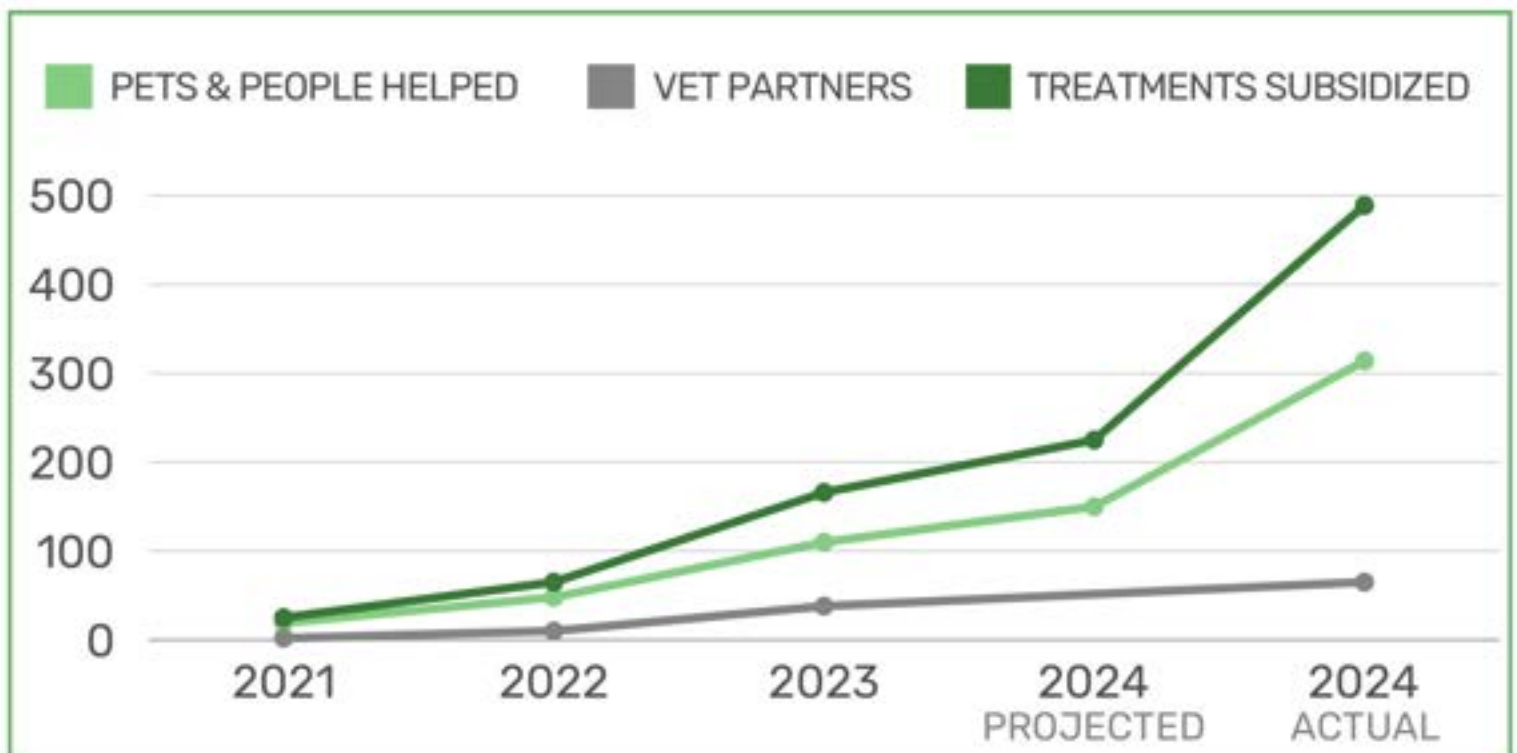
# We're Growing

45% of Canadians reported that rising prices were greatly affecting their ability to meet day-to-day expenses in 2024.

# 2025 Goals

## Help 280 Families & 300 Animals

## Raise \$100,000

The cost of vet care has rapidly risen. We carefully manage our funds to help as many as possible, so our average subsidy has stayed relatively flat at just under \$300 per pet. If funds allowed, we would expand our service area to meet more of the need across Ontario. We are completely volunteer run, ensuring >90% of our funds go directly to families and pets we serve.

## Expand our Resources

We see the need in our community and we want to help. This year we will be investing in scalable application operations, additional resources, and process streamlining. We are continuing to prioritize the development of a strong, committed volunteer team. With strategic recruitment we will expand the wealth of knowledge to further develop our free education and prevention resources which are available to everyone. We continue to build relationships and look for collaboration with like-minded organizations to facilitate preventive pet care.
